I. FORMULAS

<u>Simple sentence</u>	<u>Compound Sentence</u>
IC	IC ₂ coord. conj. IC
	IC ₂ conj. adv. ₂ IC
	IC ₂ IC

II. SIMPLE SENTENCE - a single subject / verb combination; independent clause

- I **enjoy** playing tennis with my friends.
- I **enjoy** playing tennis and **look forward to** it every weekend. ▶ compound verb
- **My friends** and **I** play tennis and go hiking every weekend. ▶ compound subject

II. COMPOUND SENTENCE - two independent clauses connected by:

1. semicolon (clauses must be closely related in meaning)
2. coordinating conjunction
3. conjunctive adverb

- I enjoy tennis, but I hate golf.
- I enjoy tennis; however, I hate golf.
- I enjoy tennis; I hate golf.
